Aloha East Maui Residents!

Another positive COVID-19 case was identified in East Maui yesterday, Tuesday, January 12. DOH has been informed and all appropriate follow-up is taking place including contact tracing. Community is advised to please limit social grouping (max group 5 persons suggested) and employ appropriate mask wearing and handwashing. Persons having symptoms should contact their healthcare provider by phone and discuss needed care and assessment issues.

HIGH PRIORITY FOR TESTING

- 1) East Maui residents who have traveled "Outside" of East Maui between 31 Dec and 14 Jan (elsewhere Maui, Oahu, neighbor islands, mainland USA). This corresponds to the incubation/infection period for COVID19 and is similar to the quarantine interval.
- 2) front-line workers, particularly hotel, vacation rental, restaurant, and food truck employees.

Participants are asked to come to the test site at their designated time, and motorists can only access the drive-through testing area by turning on to Hauoli Road from Hana Highway. Residents do not need to have insurance or meet any criteria to get the free test. Participants must wear a face mask. Results will be reported on the same day. Please call (808) 667-6161 ext: 7, for help with pre-registering.

NOTE: The free testing not valid for State's Pre-Travel Testing Program.

VACCINATION UPDATES: The community will be notified of the next clinic when additional vaccines will be available at Hana Health.

Alternately, the Maui Memorial Medical Center Vaccine clinic is open Monday to Sunday, by appointment only - visit www.mauihealth.org/covidvaccine/ for information. Maui Health will provide vaccinations to Hawai'i residents who are included in the CDC identified Phase 1A & 1B vaccine prioritization timeline, including: Healthcare Workers, Frontline Essential Workers and Adults ages 75+.

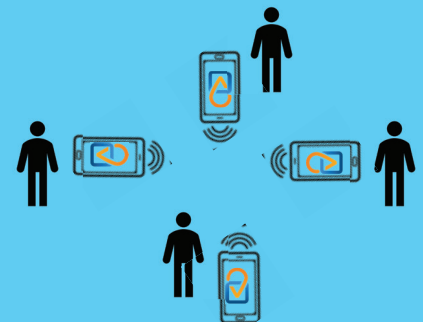

AN ALERT IS TRIGGERED ONLY IF THE
FOLLOWING MINIMUM THRESHOLD OF
EXPOSURE IS MET:

- + DISTANCE: 6 FEET OR LESS
- + DURATION: MIN OF 15 MINUTES CUMULATIVELY
- + TIMEFRAME: WITHIN THE LAST 14 DAYS
